GRADUATE MEDICAL EDUCATION (GME) TRAINING BY THE NUMBERS



Mississippi ranks **3rd** for percentage change in student enrollment at MD and DO schools – a **135%** increase from 2008.



One Mission: Created by the Mississippi State Legislature in 2012, the Office of Mississippi Physician Workforce (OMPW) develops strategies that attract, educate, and sustain a well-trained and appropriately distributed physician workforce in Mississippi, so as to ensure health care access for all Mississippians.



Each office-based physician supports a per-capital economic output of **\$3.1 million** and supports an average of **17** jobs while paying **\$1.4 million** in wages and benefits.



In **2012**, there were **12** first year ACGME training positions in the NRMP Match outside of UMMC. | In **2021**, there are **115**.



There were **4** ACGME training sites in Mississippi in **2012**. In **2021**, there are **10** with **2** more in development.



Mississippi retains **77%** of medical graduates who complete both medical school and residency training within the state.
